

Natural Gas Facts at a Glance

U.S. Energy Mix

Natural gas supplies one-fourth of all energy used in the U.S.

- 2003 consumption = 22 trillion cubic feet

Customers – 68 million +

	Number of Customers	% of Total U.S. Natural Gas Consumption
Residential	63,000,000	24%
Commercial	5,000,000	15%
Industrial (includes manufacturing)	215,000	38%
Electric Power Generation (includes electric utilities, independent power producers and industrial electricity sold back to the grid)	2,600	23%

Delivery System

- Safe – sound – and underground
- Vast 2.2 million-mile underground system
 - 1.9 million miles = distribution
 - 1.1 million miles of utility mains + 800,000 miles of utility service lines
 - 300,000 transmission lines
- Storage = 423 U.S. underground facilities

Supply

Most of the natural gas consumed in the United States is produced in the U.S.

- 85% = United States (mostly lower 48)
- 12% = Canada
- 3% = LNG imports
