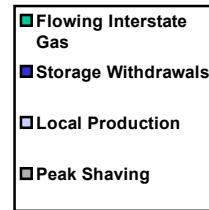
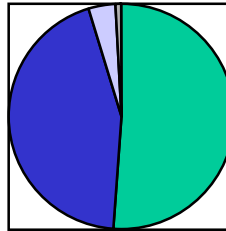

LIHEAP Funds Cut by 29% From Last Year

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program provides federal grants to help needy households establish heating service or pay their heating bills. This year, the LIHEAP program will open in Pennsylvania on Monday, November 6th. Due to decreased funds available for the upcoming winter, the Energy Association encourages customers to contact their local utilities as soon as possible to see if they are eligible for LIHEAP assistance, or to learn more about the assistance programs that utilities may offer and to see if they are eligible.
